

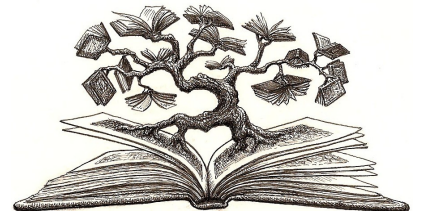

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President's Report

Once again, it is a great privilege to serve as President of the Friends of the Bellingham Public Library and work with this amazing group of Friends volunteers. Their hard work, organization and dedication to supporting our library in a variety of ways cannot be overstated. You can see some of these volunteers in action at our book sales, but many volunteers work behind the scene on a daily basis. They are all star players who make the book sales possible, raising funds that go directly to library programs. In 2017 we were able to give \$55,000 to these programs.

In 2017 we had to reduce the number of book sales from four to three due to lack of volunteer strength. This reduces the amount of money we will be able to give to the library projects in 2018. If you have been thinking about becoming a library volunteer, please contact us at the next book sale which takes place January 24-27 or give us a call at the library. You are needed.

Please remember that the Friends welcome your financial support in whatever way you wish to give. Elsewhere in this newsletter, you will find out about becoming a Friend of the Bellingham Public library and renewing your membership dues. These membership dues and other gifts to the Friends are immensely important and appreciated.

Whatcom READS 2018:

Fast-paced absorbing novel, events planned through March 2018

Whatcom READS presents "Your Heart is a Muscle the Size of a Fist," by Sunil Yapa. It's a fast-paced, raw and absorbing story set amid the 1999 World Trade Organization protests in Seattle.

Whatcom READS continues to be one of several Bellingham Public Library programs that receives significant funding from the Friends of the Bellingham Public Library, which is key to its growth and success. The Whatcom READS organization has existed now for almost a decade, with Yapa's novel being the 10th book selected by Whatcom READS organizers for community discussion and events.

The Events

Whatcom READS is a county-wide program that encourages everyone to read and discuss the same book. Book discussions, musical performances and other events are planned now through March, with author presentations March 8-10, 2018.

Author Sunil Yapa's visit to our area March 8-10 includes five free-of-charge events in Bellingham and Whatcom County, including his keynote presentation - An Evening with Sunil Yapa - at 7 p.m. March 9 on the Main Stage of the Mount Baker Theatre. No tickets are required at Whatcom READS events and seating is first-come, first-served.

Whatcom READS is organized by all public and academic libraries in Bellingham and Whatcom County and our community partner, Village Books. We receive significant funding from Friends of the Bellingham Public Library and Whatcom County Library Foundation, and support from other local businesses and organizations.

Sign Up Genius

We use the SignUpGenius (SUG) program to sign up people for all of the book sale tasks. Some volunteer names were inadvertently deleted last spring when two lists were merged. Please let us know as soon as possible if you wanted to volunteer and did not receive the January 2018 sign up by contacting us at the Friends email: friendslibrary3@gmail.com.

There are three ways to sign up to help at the book sales:

1. Sign up via SignUpGenius. SUG will be sent out one month before the first day of each sale. If you do not receive the email from SUG, first check your spam or junk folder to see if it has ended up there. Be sure to click "Submit" at the end of the page!
2. You can also log on to the SignUpGenius on the web. Click on find a sign up. When you reach the site, search for the sign up created by libraryfriendsvolunteers@gmail.com. That should take you to the currently active sign up.
3. You can call Chris Johnsen, 360-927-7326, after you receive the SUG and she will sign you up over the phone.
