Thanks to you, our generous supporters, we have plenty of excellent books for our sales. We also want to thank Village Books for their continuing donations of books in great condition for our sales. Several volunteers work in the backroom to sort, clean and ready books for the sales. It is a huge job, but these volunteers are relentless in their efforts to present the best books possible for our book sales. Because of their hard work, this year we were able to fund the Bellingham Public Library in the amount of \$55,000 for staff development, the Books for Babies program, youth and teen programming, adult programs, Whatcom Reads and funds for use with the remodeling of the library this year.

One of our goals for 2019/20 is to increase ou membership which has been stagnant for several years. To do that, we are finding new and better ways to communicate with members and potential members. You may have noticed what we call "tabling" going on in the library, with volunteers centered around a well-decorated table, talking with library users, interpreting what the Friends do for them, with the hope that they will be willing to join. Elsewhere in this newsletter you will find instructions for joining. You are needed!

Recently Library Director Rebecca Judd took the Friends Members on a tour of the library to interpret what is going to happen with the planned improvements on the main floor of the library this year. We look forward to these renovations with great excitement and anticipation. There will, of course, be some temporary inconveniences, but it will be well worth it. Our newly

remodeled library will be a delight to all library users.

#### **Director's Report: A Year in Review**

Special thanks to the Friends of the Bellingham Public Library for many contributions during 2019. Friends funding allowed us to send staff to conferences and trainings, to



help us learn and bring fresh new ideas to our library. And many of our most popular programs – like Summer Reading and Whatcom READS – would not be possible without your support.

We started 2019 by replacing our library computer system with a new one, and kept a steady pace through the year with:

- Designing a remodel of the Central Library's main floor. This project will take center stage this year, with construction expected to be completed in 2020. Visit <u>www.bellinghampubliclibrary.org</u> for schedule updates and more.
- Saying farewell to overdue fines and clearing them from patron accounts. In doing so, we join a growing number of public libraries across the country making libraries more accessible to everyone.
- Hosting dozens of group Community Conversations and, based on that feedback, drafting our Strategic Plan for 2020-2024.
- Filling vacancies and training using additional resources in the 2019-2020 city budget.
- Making changes in our day-to-day work to use resources wisely and improve public service.

#### Tabling

This year we're excited to add a new volunteer opportunity called Tabling to our outreach work for the Friends. We're looking for volunteers who enjoy meeting new people to join us in promoting our book sales, raising the visibility of the Friends, and inviting people to become members.

You may have already noticed Tabling as a new opportunity on our Sign Up Genius call for volunteers or have seen us in the Skill Share area of the library either back in October or earlier this January.

We believe that Tabling is going to be a fun and very effective way of attracting new members. Based on our tabling results from October, we did not receive a single negative comment in our conversations with



people, we had 14 new members sign up for the Friends as a result of the tabling, and of those who signed up, more than half indicated an interest in volunteering.

# Whatcom READS 2020: Read the **Book, Join the Conversation**




Featuring Eowyn Ivey, WWU Graduate and Pulitzer Prize Finalist, March 5-7, 2020

Eowyn Ivey's book "To The Bright Edge of the World" is the Whatcom READS 2020 selection. A series of programs and special events January through March follow the book's themes, culminating with Ivey's visit to Bellingham and Whatcom County

March 5-7.

Set in the first decades after the United States purchased the Alaska Territory, this year's Whatcom **READS** book features rich descriptions of the Alaskan wild, a compelling adventure story, and a fascinating glimpse at the burgeoning fields of naturalism and photography in the late 19th century. Told in epistolary form with a variety of narratives, To The Bright Edge of the World skillfully weaves history,



naturalism, and even a touch of magical realism throughout its pages.

Whatcom READS is a county-wide program that encourages everyone to read and discuss the same book. It is organized by all the public and academic libraries in Whatcom County and Village Books, with generous funding from the Friends of the Bellingham Public Library and the Whatcom County Library Foundation. Welcome to all new and renewing members of FOBPL! Thank you for the supportive response to the membership email that we sent out in early January.

Our big news regarding membership is that this year we're introducing Junior Membership to our list of membership categories. We want to make sure that everyone in Bellingham, no matter their age, feels a warm welcome to show their support for the library by becoming a Friend. A Junior Membership costs \$5 and is available to everyone aged 18 and younger.

Also this year, we are switching to a twelve month basis for membership. So, folks who join later in the year will now get a full twelve months for their membership dues. Please consider inviting your friends and family to become Friends of the Library as well.

There are several options for people to join the Friends of the Bellingham Public Library. One of the easiest is to fill out the application form in one of our membership brochures the next time they're at the library and then pay at the Help Desk. Another is to print a Friends' membership application from the Library website and send it to the address on the form with a check for payment made out to The Friends of the Bellingham Public Library.
